		[2013 (4) ALD 241] and M. Harinath v.	
		Joint Collector, Nellore [2014 (2) ALT

		Following the decisions relied on by

		2019 dated 12.11.2019, the seizure of the	
		stock and lorry is ex facie found to be	
		illegal and contrary to clause 20 (a) of	

APSTPDS (Control) Order, 2018.

Therefore, there shall be an interim direction to the respondents to release 40 bags of raw rice weighing 50 kgs each to the 1<sup>st</sup> petitioner on executing a personal bond to the value of the stock and lorry bearing No.AP 03 TC 2721 to the 2<sup>nd</sup> petitioner on production of valid documents.
