

Heard Mr.Ravi, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr.A.Prabakaran, learned counsel for private respondents. The private parties are daughter-in-law and in-laws, respectively.

- 2. One P.Nandakumar, son of the private respondent was married to the petitioner and had passed away on 10.08.2018.
- 3. Without going into the rival contentions that have been raised and argued, it appears that parties are desirous of settling the matter. The assets in question are:-
  - (i) a sum of Rs.38 lakhs (approx) received by the petitioner as terminal benefits from IBM India Pvt. Ltd.
  - (ii) property situate at Door No.17, Chozhan Street, Muthamuzh Nagar, Pammal, Chennai – 600 075
- 4. The petitioner agrees that a sum of Rs.12 lakhs would be paid over from the terminal benefits to R3.
- 5. Learned counsel for R2 and R3 on their behalf conveys that they have no objection for partition of the property at serial number (ii), in accordance with law.
- 6. Thus, to assist the parties to arrive at the terms of settlement, the matter is referred to Mediation.
