2. Petitioners are apprehending their arrest in connection with Maheshpur P.S. Case No. 222/2022 for the offences registered under sections 341/323/307/384/379/504/34 of the Indian Penal Code, pending in the court of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pakur.

3. Petitioners are alleged to have assaulted the Informant. They have also demanded Rs. 20,000/- from him by way of rangdari. There is case and counter case between the parties on the same set of allegation.

Case diary earlier called for, has been received. Perused the same. From perusal of the case diary, it appears that the Supervisory Officer has found the occurrence to be true under sections 341,323,504/34 I.P.C which are bailable in nature.

4. Mr. Gautam Kumar, learned counsel appearing for the Informant, has opposed the prayer for bail and submitted that in view of the findings of the Supervisory Officer, there is no apprehension of arrest of the petitioners.

5. Considering the fact that offences alleged appear to be bailable in nature, I am inclined to extend the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, petitioners, above named, are directed to surrender before the learned court below within two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and the learned court below on their surrender, shall release them on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees twenty five thousand) each, with two sureties of the like amount each, to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pakur in connection with Maheshpur P.S. Case No. 222/2022, subject to the conditions as laid down under section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
