6/ 09.08.2021 Heard learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned counsel for the respondents through Video Conferencing. The lawyers have no objection with regard to the proceeding, which has been held through Video Conferencing today at 10.30 a.m. They have no complain in respect to the audio and video clarity and quality.

In this writ petition, the petitioner prays for release of retiral and other dues of her deceased husband as the petitioner is entitled for the same.

It is submitted that the husband of the petitioner, namely, late Sita Ram Sao was working as 'Health Supervisor', who retired from service with effect from 30.06.2009. It is submitted that till date, the entire benefits of her husband have not been disbursed. It is further submitted that the petitioner has filed representations claiming payment of unpaid retiral and other dues of her husband, but till date no action has been taken on her representation.

Counsel appearing for JMADA submits that the representation filed by the petitioner will be looked into and appropriate order will be passed and the admissible amount will be disbursed to the petitioner as early as possible.

Considering the submissions of the respondents, I am disposing of this writ petition, directing the respondent-Managing Director, JMADA, Dhanbad, to disburse the retiral and other dues of her husband to the petitioner within a reasonable time, preferably, within a period of 6-8 weeks after disposing of the representation of the petitioner.

With the aforesaid direction, this writ petition stands disposed of.
