**02/24.04.2014:** The petitioner is an accused in the case registered under Sections 302, 201 and 120B of the Indian Penal Code.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner's prayer for bail was earlier rejected considering the submission of learned APP that Tara Lal Rajwar and Sumitra Devi were eye-witnesses to the occurrence; the said eye-witnesses have been examined as P.Ws.1 and 2 in the learned Trial Court and they have not supported the prosecution case; earlier on the same ground, prayer for bail of Manoj Kapardar was also rejected, but subsequently he has been granted bail by this Court by order dated 14<sup>th</sup> March, 2014; the petitioner is in custody since 14<sup>th</sup> March, 2013 without any cogent material on record; the petitioner is a local permanent resident; there is no chance of his absconding.

Learned A.P.P. opposed the petitioner's prayer for bail, but has not disputed the said facts and contentions based on record.

Regard being had to the facts and circumstances of the case, the petitioner, above-named, is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount, each, to the satisfaction of learned Additional Sessions Judge-II, Bermo at Tenughat in connection with S.T. No.259 of 2013, arising out of Kasmar P.S. Case No.65 of 2011, corresponding to G.R. No.1069 of 2011.
