THIS WRIT PETITION IS FILED UNDER ARTICLE 226 & 227 OF THE CONSITUTION OF INDIA, PRAYING TO QUASH ENTIRE PROCESS OF ADMISSION FOR POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMME FOR THE ACADEMIC YEARS 2017-18 CONDUCTED BY THE R-1 AS

ARBITRARY, ILLEGAL, ULTRA VIRES THE PROVISIONS OF THE INDIAN MEDICAL COUNCIL ACT, 1956 AND THE LAW DECLARED BY THE HON'BLE SUPREME COURT OF INDIA AS DETAILED IN THE POSTGRADUATE PROSPECTUS 2017-18 OF ST.JOHN MEDICAL COLLEGE, BANGALORE 560 034 AND CONSEQUENTLY QUASH THE POST GRADUATE INTERVIEW LIST PUBLISHED BY THE R-1 VIDE ITS COMMUNICATION DTD.10.2.2017 VIDE ANNEX-A & ETC.

ORDER

None for the petitioner even when the matter is called in the second round.

In this writ petition, the petitioner has sought for the following reliefs:

a) Issue appropriate writ order or direction to quash entire process of admission for postgraduate programme for the academic years 2017-18 conducted by the 1st Respondent as arbitrary, illega, ultra vires the provisions of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and the law declared by the Hon'ble

Supreme Court of India as detailed in the Postgraduate Prospectus 2017-18 of St. John Medical College, Bangalore 560034 and consequently quash the Post Graduate Interview List published by the 1st Respondent vide its Communication Dated 10th February, 2017 produced above as Annexure-A.

- b) Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to quash entire process of selective counselling being conducted by the 3rd Respondent by excluding 1st Respondent institution and leaving out non-government quota seats in private medical institutions in the State of Karnataka and consequently quash e-Brochure Karnataka State PG ET 2017 published by the 3rd Respondent that its official website is produced above as Annexure-B.
- c) Grant cost of the Writ Petition and.
- d) Pass any other appropriate writ, order or direction as the Hon'ble Court deems fit to

grant under the circumstances of the case, in the interest of justice.

On perusal of the reliefs claimed in this petition, it appears the grievance of the petitioner pertains to admission for post graduate programme for the academic year 2017-18. In this writ petition on 21.03.2017, an interim order was passed directing to keep one seat vacant. The course in which the admission was sought by the petitioner is over. Therefore, at this point of time no effective relief can be granted to the petitioner as the writ petition has become infructuous by efflux of time.

Accordingly, the petition is dismissed.
