This Writ Appeal is filed under Section 4 of the Karnataka High Court Act praying to set aside the order passed in W.P.No.47272/2001 dated 21-12-2001

This Writ Appeal coming on for preliminary hearing this day, THE CHIEF JUSTICE delivered the following:

JUDGMENT

This writ appeal is filed against the order dated 21-12-2001 passed in W.P.No.47272/2000 wherein the learned Single Judge has not interfered with the order of the Regional Transport authority assigning timings to the stage carriages. The appeal was filed with an application for condonation of delay of 83 days in refiling the appeal.

- 2..Heard the learned counsel for the parties and perused the material on record.
- 3.Generally this Court is lenient in condoning the delay provided sufficient and reasonable cause is shown. In the instant case we find no good reason to condone the delay in refiling the appeal. That apart, no writ lies in the matter of assignment of timings. Hence, I.A.I/2002 is dismissed. Consequently, writ appeal is also dismissed.
