- 1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
- 2. Heard Mr. B.P. Mohanty, learned counsel appearing for the Appellant-Claimant, Mr. N.B. Sarkar, learned counsel appearing for the Respondent No. 2, Mr. S. Roy, learned counsel appearing for Respondent No. 3 and Mr. G.P. Dutta, learned counsel appearing for Respondent No. 4.
- 3. The present appeal has been filed by the Appellant-Claimant seeking enhancement of the compensation so awarded by the 4th MACT, Puri vide Judgment dtd.15.09.2023 in MAC Case No. 47 of 2013.
- 4. Learned counsel appearing for the Appellant-Claimant contended that on the face of the claim made to the tune of Rs.6,00,000/-, the Tribunal without proper appreciation of the materials placed before it, only awarded compensation amount of Rs.46,970/- along with



interest @ 9% per annum payable from the date of filing of the claim application till its realization.

- 4.1. In support of the enhancement of the award, learned counsel appearing for the Appellant-Claimant contended that compensation awarded towards loss of earning during the period of treatment and towards pain and suffering has been assessed at a lower side.
- 4.2. However, in course of hearing learned counsel appearing for the Appellant-Claimant contended that if this Court will allow further compensation amount of Rs.35,000/- consolidated, Appellant-Claimant will have no grievance.
- 5. Mr. S. Roy, learned counsel appearing for the Respondent No. 3-Company though supported the impugned award and contended that the award has already been satisfied with, but to the submission made for award of further compensation of Rs.35,000/- consolidated to the learned counsel for Appellant, left the same to the discretion of this Court.
- 6. Having heard learned counsel appearing for the Parties and considering the submissions made, this Court is inclined to dispose of the appeal by holding the Appellant-Claimant entitled to get further compensation amount of Rs.35,000/- consolidated. While holding so, this Court directs Respondent No. 3-Company to deposit the aforesaid compensation amount of Rs.35,000/- consolidated before the Tribunal within a period of eight (8) weeks from the date of receipt of this order. On such deposit of the amount, the Tribunal shall disburse the same in favour of the Appellant-Claimant in full.



- 6.1. However, it is observed that if the amount as directed is not deposited within the aforesaid time period, the compensation amount of Rs.35,000/- consolidated will carry interest @ 6% per annum payable for the period starting from the expiry of the period of eight (8) weeks till the amount is so deposited.
- 7. The appeal is accordingly disposed of.
