Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, the petitioner has approached this court by way of instant petition, under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when despite the order dated 29.8.2012 (Annexure P-7) having been passed by the competent authority, the same was not being implemented, without disclosing any reason, petitioner approached the respondent authorities by way of representation dated 20.2.2013 (Annexure P-8), but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied, in case respondent no.1 is directed to consider and decide the representation of the petitioner, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, including the issue of limitation, if any, Superintending Canal Officer, Ferozepur Canal Circle, Ferozepur-respondent no.1 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner, raised vide her representation dated 20.2.2013 (Annexure P-8), which prima facie seems to be genuine and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of 30 days from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the observations made above, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
