[1] Prayer in the petition is for initiating proceedings against the respondent for intentional and willful defiance of order, Annexure P/1 dated 27.08.2021 in CWP No.16683 of 2021 in case titled as Bhagwant Singh vs. State of Punjab and Ors.

[2] A perusal of order, Annexure P/1 reveals that CWP No.16683 of 2021 was disposed of by directing the official respondents to consider legal notice dated 12.07.2021 as representation moved by the petitioner and decide the same in accordance with law by passing a speaking order preferably within one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order and in case the petitioner was found entitled and there was no impediment for the release of payment, to release the same to the petitioner as per law without any delay.

[3] Learned AAG on the previous date i.e. 26.08.2022, produced copy of speaking order dated 25.08.2022 though the same was in vernacular and had taken time to produce translated copy of speaking order dated 25.08.2022.

[4] Today, learned AAG has filed compliance report dated

27.08.2022 along with copy of speaking order Annexure R-1/T dated 25.08.2022/26.08.2022 accepting the claim of the petitioner. The same has been handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner, who on perusal thereof states that in the circumstances, he does not press the instant petition and may be permitted to withdraw the same.

[5] In view of the position noted above as well as the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the contempt petition is disposed of as not calling for any action against the respondent under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.
