Delay condoned.

We are not inclined to interfere with the impugned judgment on the question of determination with respect to the Schedule 'A' landed property.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners, however, submits that there were three heirs, including the sister. Therefore, each one of them, as held by the trial court, would be entitled to one-third share. The impugned judgment, however, declares one-half share for each of the brothers and excludes the

sister.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners states that the petitioners would file a review application/petition only on the said aspect before the High Court. If an application/petition for review is filed, the same may be considered and decided in accordance with law.

Recording the aforesaid, the special leave petition is dismissed.
